Butternut Squash and Volunteer Forum Turkey Chili

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 pound ground turkey
- 1 pound (1 small) butternut squash peeled, seeded, and cut into 1-inch cubes
- 1 cup low-sodium chicken broth
- 1 (4.5-ounce) can chopped green chilies
- 2 (14.5-ounce) cans petite diced tomatoes
- 1 (15-ounce) can no-salt-added kidney beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 (15.5-ounce) can white hominy, drained
- 1 (8-ounce) cán tomato sauce
- 1 tablespoón chili powder
- 1 tablespoon ground cumin
- 1/2 teaspoon salt

Directions:

- 1. Heat the olive oil in a large pot over medium heat.
- 2. Stir in the onion and garlic; cook and stir for 3 minutes or until onion is translucent.
- 3. Add ground turkey. Break into pieces and stir until cooked through and no longer pink.
- 4. Add the butternut squash, chicken broth, green chilies, tomatoes, kidney beans, hominy, and tomato sauce.
- 5. Season with chili powder, cumin, and salt.
- 6. Bring to a simmer, reduce heat to medium-low, and
- 7. Simmer until the squash is tender, about 20 minutes.
